111/2022 Flixborough Wharf/Industrial Estate Noise and Light Pollution

PC contacted the commercial section of The Department for the Environment who stated that the following instructions must be followed:

- Residents to make a complaint. You would have to do this personally, the Parish Clerk cannot do this on your behalf. This can be done either through their website or emailing environmental.health@northlincs.gov.uk
- The Environmental Health Department would use the information given to investigate the complaint then they would attempt to contact the company/companies involved and try to solve the issue with conversations.
- Failing the above solving the problem the residents would be asked to complete diary sheets. Depending on the frequency of the noise, the diary sheets would need to be completed for approximately 2 weeks.
- Again, with the information from the diary sheets, the Environmental Health Department would attempt to contact the company/companies involved and try to solve the issue with conversations.

- Failing this, the Environmental Health Department would use noise monitoring equipment on the industrial estate. If the results of this were deemed to be a problem then they would serve a notice to the company/companies involved.

An abatement notice has been served on a crane on Flixborough Wharf after receiving results from monitoring equipment from a residents home.

PC to contact Flixborough Wharf regarding changing position of lights. No further complaints have been received as not noticed/needed due to light nights.
