## Things you need to know

- Children must be accompanied by an adult
- Wear appropriate footwear. You will need stout shoes/walking boots or wellingtons.
- Wear appropriate outdoor clothing.
- Be prepared, walking requires physical exertion. Do not attempt to walk long distances if unsure.
- If on the moors; there are many old peat workings, drains and watercourses. You are strongly advised to keep to marked walls and existing tracks.
- Please take responsibility for your own safety.
- Take care in urban areas watching out for traffic and sticking to pedestrianised routes.
- In hot weather, bring a sun hat, drinking water and insect repellent.
- Do not leave valuables in car.
- Danger deep water. No Swimming
- Snakes live here. Do not touch them or invade their space.
- Follow the Countryside Code of Conduct:
- ➤ Be safe, plan ahead and follow the signs
- Leave gates and property as you find them.
- ➤ Protect plants and animals and take your litter home.
- > Keep dogs under effective control
- > Consider other people.
